## FIRST ANNOUNCEMENT

#### Introduction

The Baltic Sea Science Congress is an international forum for researchers of the Baltic Sea countries and is uniting the three major scientific communities: the Conference of Baltic Oceanographers (CBO), Baltic Marine Biologists (BMB), and Baltic Sea Geologists (BSG). The objective of the congress is to bring together marine scientists and experts as well as young researchers. The **headline** of the coming Congress will be "Joint research efforts for sustainable ecosystem management".

The 8<sup>th</sup> BSSC is continuing a series of successful biennial congresses held in the Baltic countries.



As it was agreed at the 7<sup>th</sup> BSSC in Tallinn, the 8<sup>th</sup> Congress will be organized by Russian State Hydrometeorological University (RSHU) (<u>www.rshu.ru</u>) in cooperation with other Russian research institutions and scientific societies, and with large contribution of CBO, BMB and BSG.

#### Time and venue

The 8<sup>th</sup> Baltic Sea Science Congress will be held on **August 22-26, 2011**, in the city of St.Petersburg, Russia. It will be conducted in one of the modern hotels of St.Petersburg located in the centre part of the city.

The Congress will start on August 22 (Monday) afternoon and end on August 26 (Friday). It will include Plenary sessions, Thematic sessions and Workshops, and a Poster session. Social and cultural events will be held after the Congress (August 27, 2011).

#### The preliminary programme

A Tallinn Declaration was adopted at the 7<sup>th</sup> BSSC, and it was noted there that "the pace and scale of anthropogenic pressures upon the Baltic Sea ecosystem are faster and larger than the development of knowledge needed to estimate and predict ecological and socio-economic consequences". The 7<sup>th</sup> BSSC recommended to strengthen the research efforts to overcome this gap and to develop scientific recommendations for sustainable ecosystem management of the Baltic Sea. Following these guidelines, the scientific themes of the 8<sup>th</sup> Baltic Sea Science Congress will include various interdisciplinary directions of integrated physical, geological, chemical, biological and socio-economic research. They will include open sea and coastal zone multiscale dynamics, ecosystem and habitat structure and functions, palaeogeography of the Baltic Basin, marine sedimentology and geochemistry, climate change and human activity impact, linking ecological research developments with the advanced information technologies, strategies and tools for resource management and environmental policy-making, etc.

The Scientific Steering Committee will decide on the final themes of the Congress sessions according to the proposals made in due time.

## Call for sessions and workshops themes' proposals: Deadline - October 10, 2010

Proposals should include the title, short description and names of the three possible conveners of the session and be sent to the Congress contact by e-mail.

The final Scientific Programme will be compiled by the Scientific Steering Committee based on the submitted abstracts.

Selected papers of the 8<sup>th</sup> Baltic Sea Science Congress will be published in an international scientific journal soon after the end of the Congress.
